Giuseppe



(1527 - July 11, 1593) was an Italian painter best known for creating imaginative portrait heads made entirely of such objects as fruits, vegetables, flowers, fish, and books - that is, he painted representations of these objects on the canvas arranged in such a way that the whole collection of objects formed a recognisable likeness of the portrait subject.

Arcimboldo



Vincent Van Gogh was born in 1853 in the Netherlands. He worked as an art dealer and then as a teacher before deciding to become an artist in 1880. His first paintings were dark toned scenes of poor workers. After visiting Paris and the meeting of other artists Van Gogh began using much brighter, bolder colours. His pictures then



included landscapes, still lifes, portraits and self-portraits, and were characterised by bold colours and dramatic, expressive brushwork that contributed to the foundations of modern art.
